Introduction

Safeguarding and the welfare of swimmers is of paramount importance and must be ensured at all times. The Club's safeguarding leads are also its Welfare Officers. Coaches, and a number of committee members who have completed Swim England safeguarding training.

All relevant personnel have been DBS checked.

There is always expertise on hand to deal with any safeguarding/welfare issues that arise.

The main contacts to whom issues should be reported are the Welfare Officers shown on the front page of this document, however, issues can be raised via any club official via email or face-to-face interaction.

All issues, however reported, will be passed to the Welfare Officers. They will determine the appropriate actions to be taken.
